Q: What is the difference between There, Their, and They're?

A: There is a location, their is the possessive form of they, and they're is a contraction of they are.

Q: When should I use There?

A: Use there to indicate a location, such as "The pencil is there on the table."

A: Use their to show ownership or possessive form of they, such as "The students brought their pencils with them."

Q: What does the contraction They're mean?
